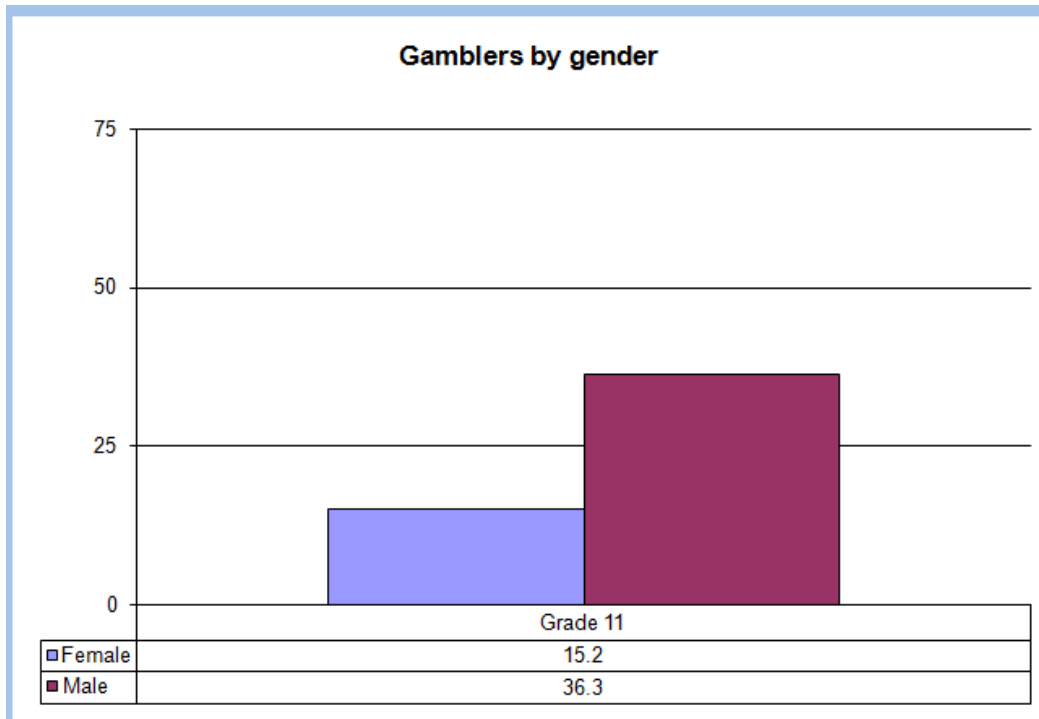


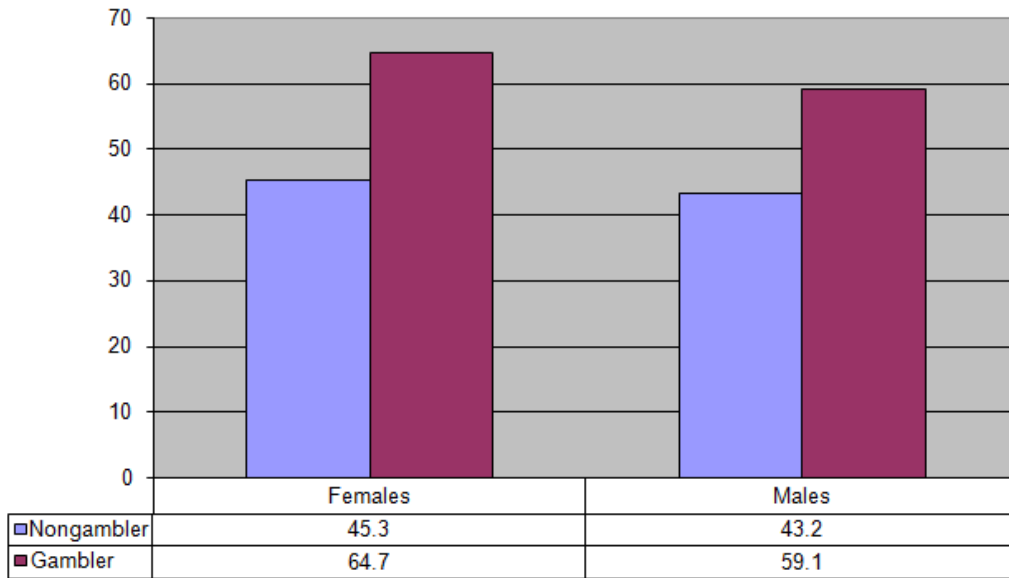

11th Graders and Gambling

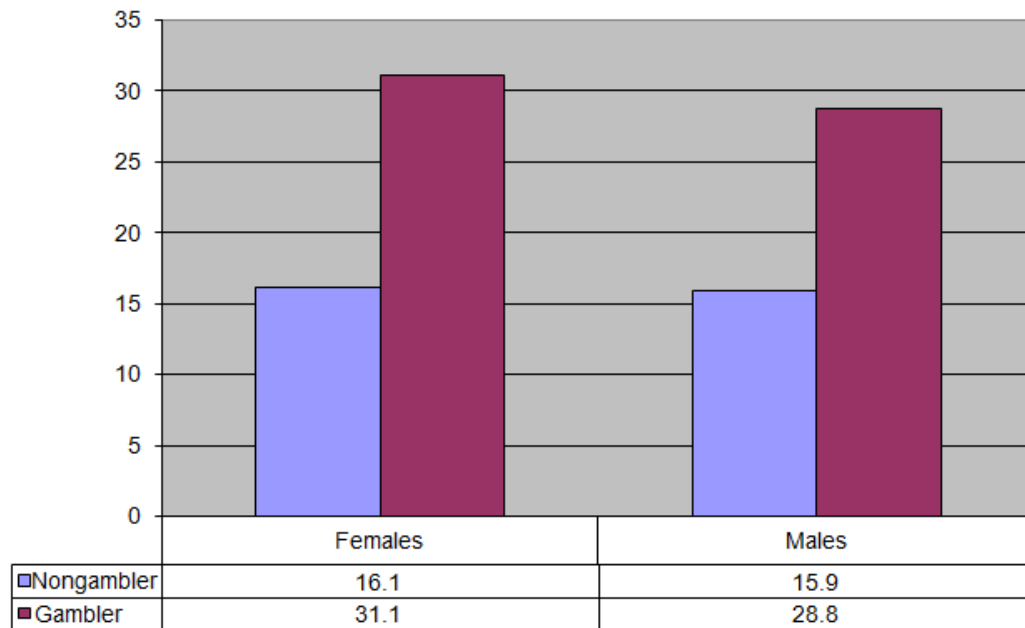
- Youth who gamble are much more likely to be involved in other risky behaviors
- Gambling needs to be included in discussions of healthy choices and risky behaviors at school, in the community and at home
- Gambling is not a harmless alternative activity for youth
- Boys are more likely to gamble than girls
- Efforts to include gambling in the discussion in places/systems where high risk youth are already engaged are important (alternative high schools, juvenile justice, at-risk intervention programs)



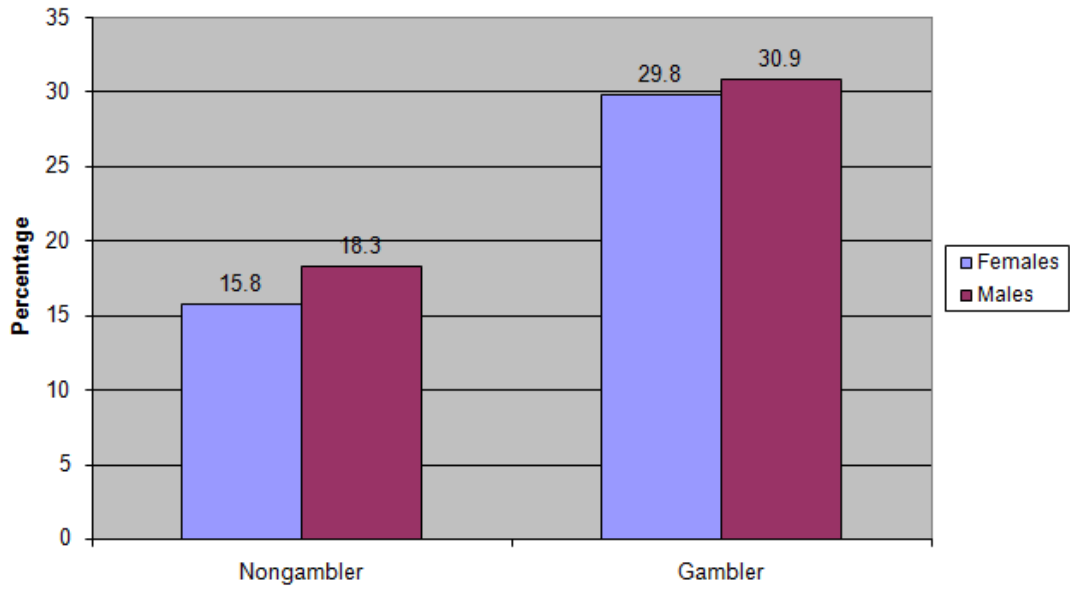
Percent who drank alcohol on one or more occasion in the past 30 days, grade 11



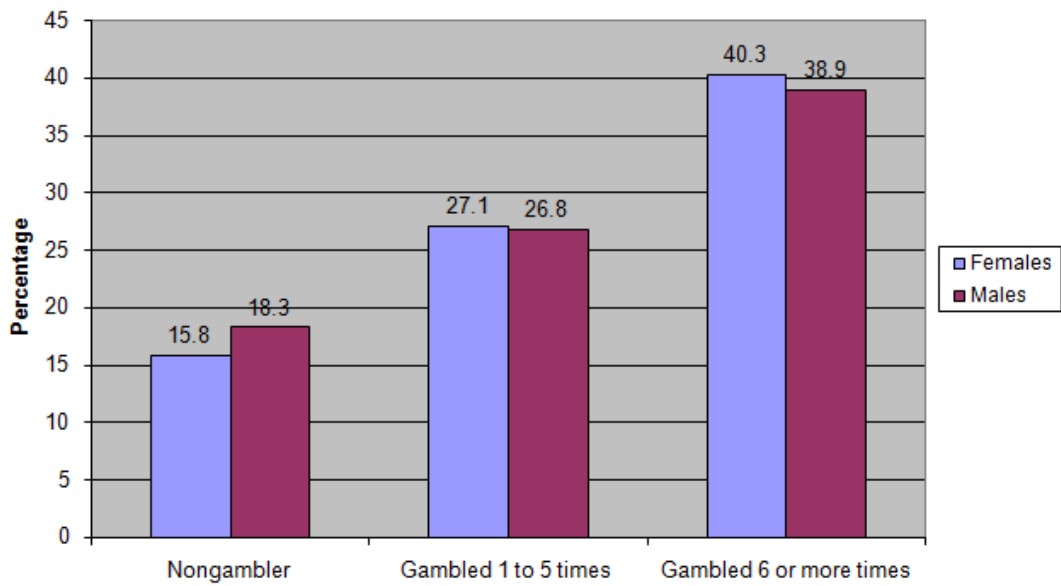
Percent who binge drank in the last 30 days, grade 11



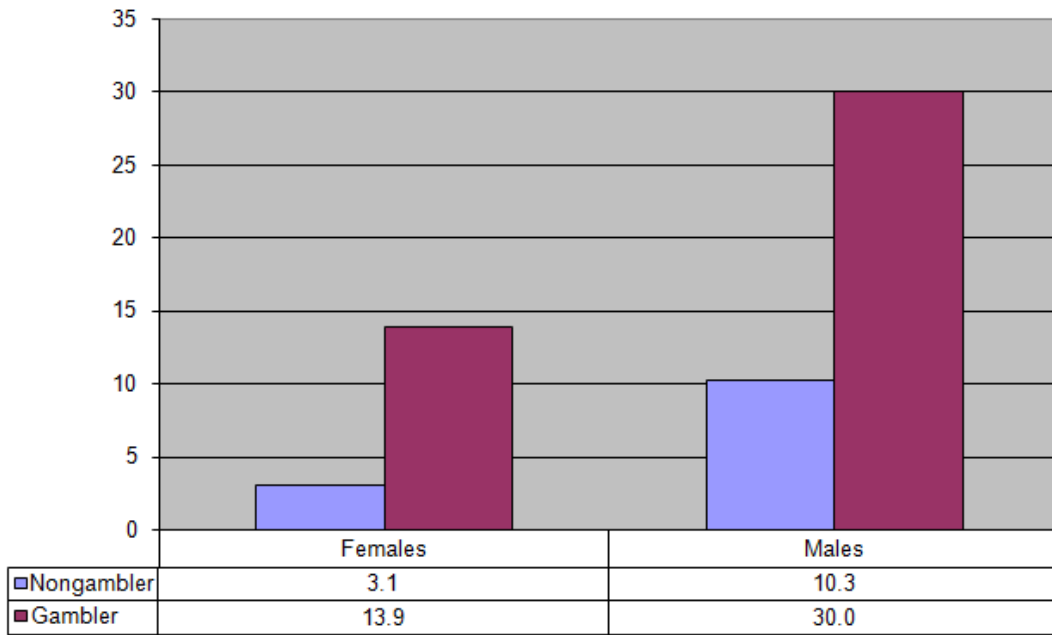
Percent of 11th graders who used cigarettes or other tobacco products in the past month, 2007



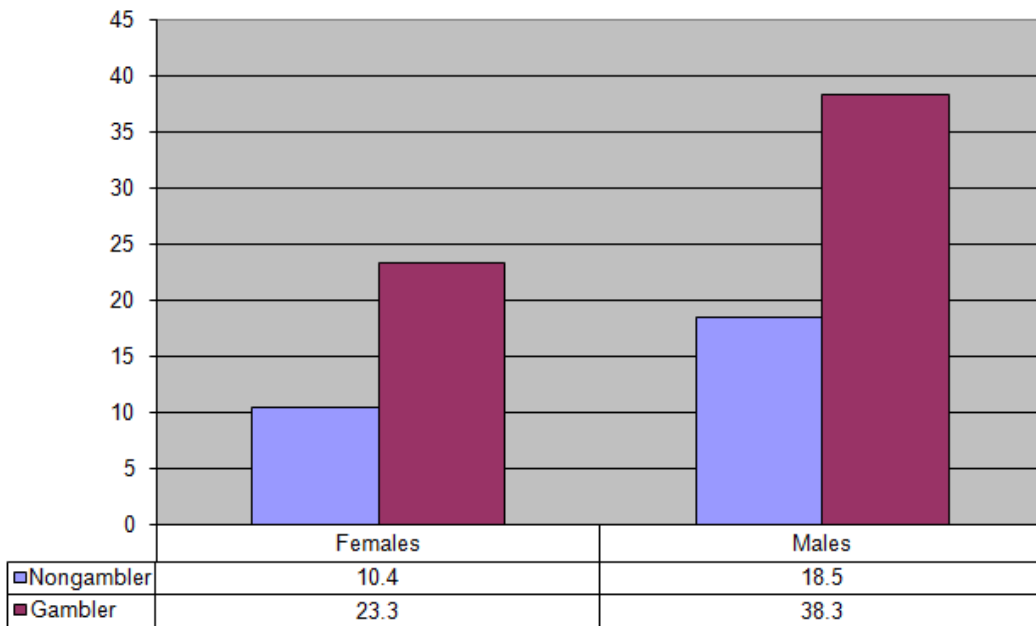
Percent of 11th graders who used cigarettes or other tobacco product in past month, 2007
