SE 80 requirements

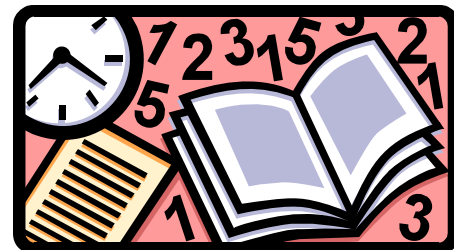
- By 7/1/2011 SE 80 funds must be overseen by a Certified Prevention Specialist

Our Vision: All youth in Oregon are healthy & successful learners who contribute positively to their communities.



Healthy Kids Learn Better (HKLB) is a statewide effort to help local schools and communities form partnerships and reduce physical, social and emotional barriers to learning. This program is currently being re-organized as a Public Health Division-led effort.

Together we are reducing barriers to learning in many ways, including:

- Promoting, at the state level, the connections between health and education, and building supportive funding, leadership and policy through implementation of the Coordinated School Health Blueprint for Action
- Providing technical assistance to local school districts on forming Healthy Kids Learn Better Teams, assessing their local needs and developing a Coordinated School Health Approach
- Training teachers on research-based health and prevention curricula
- Providing assistance on building and selecting comprehensive health education programs that work



64 educators received the middle school youth video and curriculum during mini trainings.

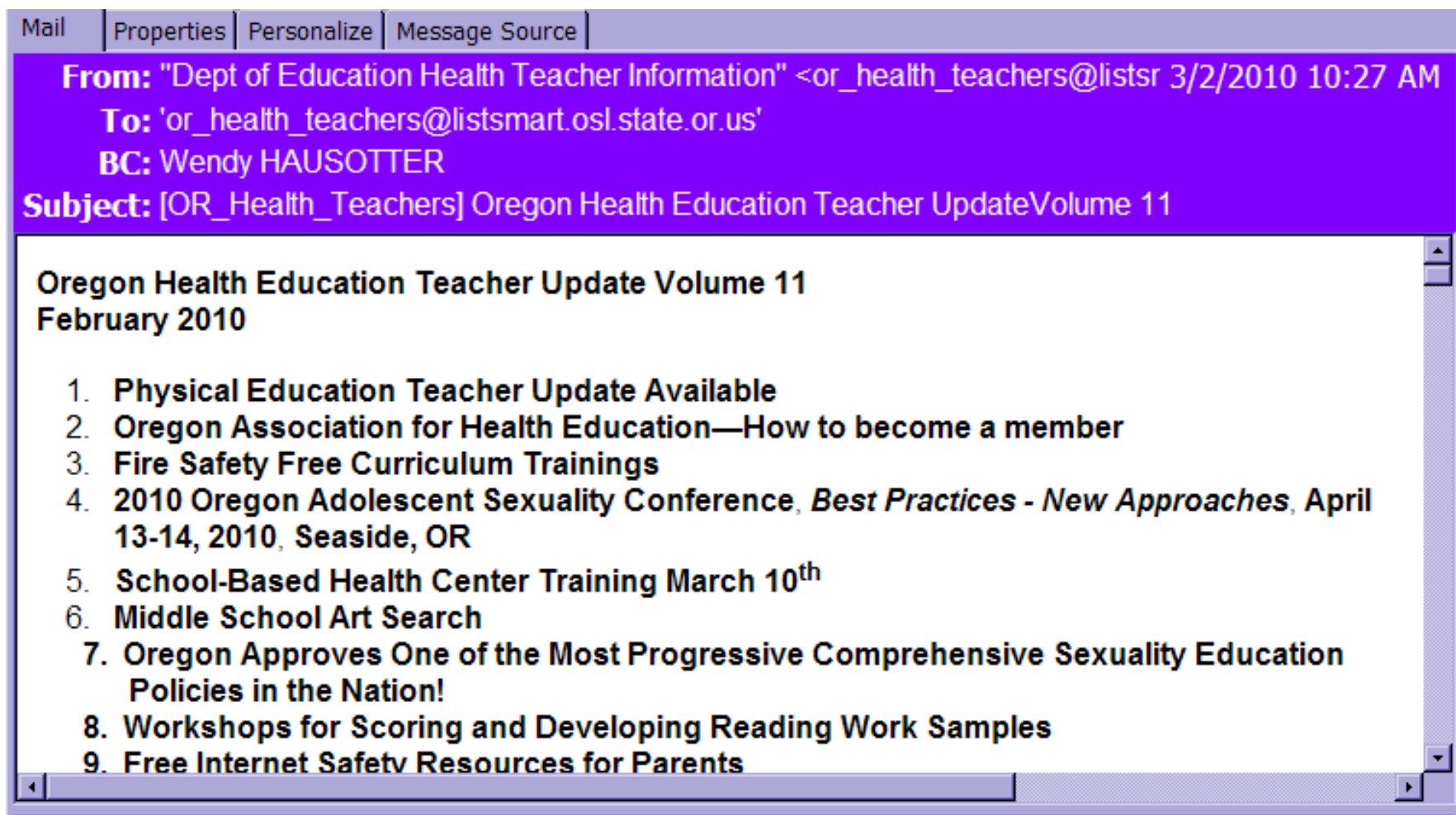
A Training of trainers was provided for the HKLB Cadre.

Three performance assessments were developed.

A list of action items was generated for future consideration:

- Create high school PG materials (DONE and will become training materials for current year efforts w/HKLB)
- Promote PG materials as a peer education topic
- Provide trainings for counselors and nurses to share/tech material and provide support resources/best practices (useful for intervention)
- Prepare a handout on correlation between PG and other risk behaviors
